## FROM WHAT'S OUR WHY TO HERE IS OUR HOW: INTRODUCING PAL CENTER'S FUTURE FORWARD PROJECT

It's hard to believe, but we are closing in on our 30-year anniversary! Founded as the Redwood City Police Athletic League in 1995, we evolved into the Police Activities League in 2004, and then we transitioned into Pal Center in 2023. Our transition to Pal Center, which involved a comprehensive rebrand, recognizes the moment we are in and our deployment of a comprehensive, systems-level approach to rooting out systemic racism, breaking the school-to-prison pipeline, and reversing the effects of decades of neglect and disinvestment in our community.

Today, our approach includes leveraging the strengths of our community and building upon pre-existing assets to create a model for sustainable change that can be replicated and scaled. Our approach encompasses **social equity, economic empowerment**, and **public safety** through a proven, Community Capital Development Framework.

"Community Capitals" are the seven areas of investment every community needs to thrive (natural, cultural, human, social, political, financial, and built). We envision our ongoing strategic investments across these capitals creating greater opportunity for our community members to realize their potential and recognize their power to shape their realities. For example, we invest in our community's political capital by elevating their voice and fostering trusted spaces for them to speak directly to elected officials and policy leaders.

Our Future Forward Project also seeks to address social determinants of physical and mental health: those non-medical factors such as socioeconomic status, community engagement, and geographic location that affect our health. For example, our Community for Wellness and Community as Medicine initiatives are designed not only to improve individual health, but also to address loneliness and isolation, which harms individuals and the overall community.

Investing in and building upon these evidence-based frameworks has the potential to significantly improve the health, safety, economic mobility, and well-being of our community.

#### **Objectives of Pal Center's Future Forward Project:**

<u>Strengthen Social Equity</u>: Pal Center promotes cultural wealth by celebrating and integrating diverse cultural backgrounds and interest-based activities into all aspects of our programs, thereby fostering an inclusive environment and increased sense of belonging in the community.

<u>Promote Economic Empowerment</u>: Through financial literacy workshops, workforce development opportunities, and paid internships, we help the community members we serve to build strong economic foundations and develop pathways to generational wealth.

<u>Improve Public Safety</u>: Relying on our ever-strengthening alliances with first responders and our holistic approach to community well-being, we bridge the gap between the community and public safety officials to generate trust and mutual understanding.

# **CORE PROGRAM #1:** COMMUNITY CARE & ENRICHMENT

This component offers a K-8 after-school program to introduce children to new activities and nurture social-emotional educational development through tutoring, creative arts, hands-on science experiments, and mentorship. We also offer organized sports and recreational activities to expose kids to building their physical and mental health, character, and confidence.

#### **Goals and Impacts:**

- · Help kids feel safe and excited about playing and making new friends
- Increase the number of positive relationships kids have with adults
- · Equip kids with the emotional and social awareness to tackle life's daily challenges
- · Increase number of kids enrolled in after-school programs

- · Provide training opportunities for youth mentors
- · Create an inclusive community where kids feel safe, supported, and motivated
- Cultivate confidence and lifelong learning

# **CORE PROGRAM #2: COMMUNITY FOR WELLNESS**

This component centers on weekly, motivation-based health and wellness coaching in a supportive community to address isolation and other social determinants of health.

#### **Goals and Impacts:**

- Reduce isolation
- Increase activity and exercise
- Encourage healthful eating habits
- · Leverage community-based life coaching to reinforce healthy habits and reduce unnecessary hospitalizations
- Create a sustainable, long-term, community wellness ecosystem
  Build a community-powered network of neighborhood health activists
- Increase weekly minutes of exercise and daily servings of healthy food
- · Produce measurable improvements in health outcomes (blood pressure, depression, anxiety, etc.)

# CORE PROGRAM #3: COMMUNITY POWER PATH

This component is a multi-faceted approach – using advocacy, mentoring, program referrals, and parental support – to expand teen access to jobs; educational, enrichment, and mentorship programs; and leadership opportunities. Also, the Community Power Path entails improved service delivery by city agencies and nonprofit organizations and drastically expanded services for hard-to-reach youth. Those efforts are all toward building a pipeline of youth ready to succeed in decision-making roles on formal Redwood City advisory bodies.

   officers in a safe environment
- Ensure youth are heard and represented in civic matters
- · Build a government that better reflects the people it serves
- Enhance the capacity of city agencies and NGOs to serve our youth with programming tailored to their unique needs
- Improve educational outcomes
- · Increase paid internship and job opportunities
- · Create more BIPOC-youth representation in civic advisory positions

# THE POWER OF OUR PROGRAMS




Pal Center programs are the primary way we serve our community day-in, day-out, day after day. Community members of all walks of life benefit from those programs. Here are capsules describing some of our programs followed by a series of stories about how Pal Center programs impact individuals.

# TRANSFORMING LIVES THROUGH COMMUNITY AND COLLABORATION

Each holiday season, Pal Center and RCPD bring joy to hundreds of families in Redwood City and North Fair Oaks through a Toy Drive in collaboration with the Fair Oaks Community Center, RWC Fire, Sheriffs, and a corps of community volunteers. The hustle and bustle that brings together all these partners in the effort to collect toys, gift wrapping and delivery is true testament to the power of community and key agencies pulling together to delight our youth. Beyond the gifts of the toys themselves, our joint effort gives kids the comfort of knowing they are seen, cared for, and valued.



Pal Center collaborates with RCPD and the San Mateo County Probation Office to offer a free Tattoo Removal service. Removing tattoos that stigmatize their bearers due to their past life circumstances gives those individuals increased opportunities for a balanced life as well as educational and employment opportunities. In turn, recipients of the tattoo removal services are more likely than before to fully re-integrate into the community and contribute to its advancement.

# **INDIVIDUAL IMPACT STORIES**

Pal Center programs impact hundreds of lives. That impact is not necessarily immediate, nor is it likely to occur dramatically in one fell swoop. More often, it results from relationships built over time through consistent caring between our staff and those we serve. So many seemingly small everyday acts add up to a lot in the hearts and minds of our community members as they share here in their own words.



Katherine notes that her daughter's motivation to do her homework has increased since starting the after-school program. Her daughter enjoys coming to the Pal Center and enjoys participating in the sports leagues, which has had a profound impact on helping her focus on tasks.

Said Katherine: "The program has been immensely helpful. It has made her feel more motivated. She likes going to Pal Center to see her friends. All of this has been to her favor. I've considered her more friendly and sociable, and her vocabulary has improved.

Luis has found Pal Center's support groups beneficial as a source of connection to partner organizations, such as Una Vida.

Said Luis: "I have gained a deeper understanding of a wide range of topics through these groups around mental health and family health. I was having a tough time, and it has helped me a lot, especially the organization One Life. Now I go to therapy with them, and they have helped me so much. All of the shared information has helped. I got to meet my therapist at the focus groups at Pal."

Soila most benefited from a Pal Center Coffee and Community Event, especially for the chance to engage in conversations with others about various topics. "It was a moment where I felt very comfortable and at home with the community," she said. "The event left a strong impression on me, and I enjoyed it so much that I made sure to mark the date on my calendar to ensure I wouldn't miss any of the sessions.

"I liked all of the chats I had and how Rocio has made us feel as a family, providing breakfast in the morning and then continue with our conversations. I liked how the day started and how space is held for us. I would temporarily forget my problems, and it allowed me to connect with more people."

# CCE (AFTER-SCHOOL) & SUMMER SUNRISE PROGRAM IMPACTS

Camila was initially quite shy with classmates and mentors. However, over the course of the year, she ended up becoming an assistant to Pal Center's kindergarten mentor. Camila helped by walking the children to the pick-up area and, after finishing her own homework and enrichment activities, made a significant impact by assisting younger students with their reading and homework.



Said Camila's mother: "The program helped Cami, a lot. At the beginning she did not want to participate. But after some time, she began blossoming and shinning within. She enjoyed her peers to the point of demonstrating leadership qualities in her class. It was beautiful to watch the process of her personal evolution.

"One day, Camila's mentors showed her class how to build a cardboard radio. She came home excited, told me how she was able to build it, and imitated how the music would come out. Camila is a smart girl, but at the beginning, it was a challenge with her grades. With Pal's support she was able to get help. I come from Mexico, and the education system here is different. It's been so helpful finding Pal because they have put a lot of effort into helping her.

"For Cami, it has been a beautiful experience. She wants to continue going to Pal, and it has motivated her to participate more. She has become a different person since her first day. The program has supported me a lot, and I have also been able to meet personal goals, as a mother, knowing my daughter is in great hands, all thanks to the program."

# COMMUNITY POWER PATH PROGRAM IMPACTS: PACE, YEEE, VOICE

Evelin, newly arrived to the United States, has benefited from the program, despite the difficulty she experienced in comparison with peers who arrived at a younger age. Pal Center has filled gaps that helped prepare her for high school and in the long term.

Said Evelin: "The program has helped me meet new people and taught me how to make healthy friendships. It has allowed me to trust more in people and know that I am not alone. Something I learned from the pace program is to always think positively. You are able to overcome anything if you work hard, have a strong community, and are passionate.

"It was nice meeting the leaders like Gustavo from the credit union or Castro because they always looked like they were having fun and were friends with Tito, and that taught me that I can be passionate about my hobbies and still be in community. I want to help people, and it was cool to participate in the financial literacy classes. I love the mentors because they all seem like friends, and they make me feel safe because I know they'll listen and understand me."

Osvin has benefited from PACE helping to adjust his point of view and understand that he is not alone. PACE mentors have helped him develop as a young adult, and he has become more confident and open.

Said Osvin: "I already knew Betzy and Tito, and it was cool seeing Alan, Ingrid, and Daniel because they felt more like a friend group, even when they were teaching us something. It's different from middle school since they taught us real-life skills outside of class, which was better.

"It was great meeting Castro! We got to paint a mural on a rooftop and see all the other murals he's done. Plus, we got 7/11 slushies, which was my favorite part! I also enjoyed visiting Cañada College and meeting Tito's friends. They showed us a room with sound bowls, and it was my first time at a college. It's good to know I have someone I can ask for help now. I would like to see the mentors more often! It doesn't have to be an event. I like just hanging out with them and visiting new places."



# **2023-24 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW**



## Income

Total Income: \$2,577,546.90

## **Expenses**

Total Expenses: \$2,514,171.50

## Net Gain

Gain: \$63,375.00

Closing out the fiscal year, this overview of our financial performance shows a total income of \$2,577,546.90 and total expenses of \$2,514,171.50, resulting in a net gain. Both our income and expenses were slightly under our projections, reflecting programmatic adjustments we implemented in response to evolving community needs and city dynamics.

#### Strategic Reinvestment of Net Gain

The net gain of \$63,375 will be reinvested to support key areas:

#### 1. New Community As Medicine Program

Launching in September 2024, this program will address community health needs, with funds allocated for setup, staffing, outreach, and culturally relevant programming.

### 2. Staff Retention and Wellness Benefits

To retain our dedicated team amid rising living costs, we are enhancing wellness benefits, including improved health coverage and additional support services.

#### Managing Increased Operational Costs

We face rising operational costs, including a 13% increase in health insurance premiums and a \$100,000+ reduction in a school district contract for expanded learning opportunities programs (ELOP) compared with last year. These challenges are significant, but our net gain will help offset these costs.

### Proactive Financial Planning

We are conducting a full cost analysis of each of our core programs to mitigate potential funding impacts from external sources, ensuring our ability to sustain successful programs and launch new initiatives. Your continued support is crucial as we navigate these challenges and opportunities, ensuring we continue to enrich the lives of children and families in our community.
